Book loans, reservations, fines

- There are no book loan limits (yet 😊).
- Loan period: 2 months for the first loan. It is renewable after one month.
- Reservations can be made via the [online catalogue](#), telephone and [e-mail](#).
- Every tenth day after the end of the loan period. Reminders are automatically generated - the Library is not obligated to send them!
- Fines: The first reminder is not chargeable; each subsequent reminder notice is subject to the [Schedule of charges](#). In your own interest, please study it 😊
- The fines can be paid in cash or by bank transfer to the school's account. Unfortunately, it is not possible to pay by card.
- The Library may refer the matter of unpaid fines to the Study Department.
- Anyone may return the borrowed items.



- Anyone can pick up the loans; however, you are required to announce it in advance by e-mail (who shall pick up the items).
- The loans can be returned by post/parcel service/courier. However, you shall bear the shipping costs and risks.

Where can I find the theses?

- The printed theses are available in the Library. Please notify the Library one day in advance, as they are stored in the archive.
- Theses can also be read online within [AIS](#) (since 2008, and the older ones optionally); they are also available via the public portal [Theses](#) (since 2015).

Are there any electronic resources available?

- The [EMERALD OPERATIONS, LOGISTICS & QUALITY](#) database contains scientific journals for operational, logistics and quality management. It is intended for students, researchers and professionals involved in the field.
- [JSTOR](#) database. The ARTS & SCIENCE VI collection contains a digital archive of top American social science journals. The BUSINESS II collection is the digital archive of major American journals in economics, politics, law, and psychology.
- The [TAYLOR & FRANCIS BUSINESS, MANAGEMENT & ECONOMICS](#) database provides access to information from scholarly journals published by Taylor & Francis covering accounting, finance, business, management and economics.
- The databases mentioned above are also available remotely (from home), 24/7.
- The National Digital Library (in its [Works Unavailable on the Market](#) segment) offers full texts of documents (books, magazines, newspapers, etc.) published in the Czech Republic up to 2007 (periodicals - issues up to 2010). They are documents protected by copyright (i. e., the 70-year period has not expired since the death of the author) that are not available on the market, including further editions, possibly modified or electronic. Furthermore, the WUM interface provides access to the full texts of documents that are free (no longer protected by copyright) from the point of view of copyright. (Authentication via eduID; the same login credentials as for AIS, i. e., you have to confirm the terms and conditions and login with the right eduID user).

- The Library has an ASPI system - Automated System for Legal Information.
